News from the Board

Drive throughs...Sentry has been completing regular drive throughs of our neighborhood. If you're not familiar with the CC&R's they are available on the Eagle Springs portal at Sentry. A letter is mailed out outlining violations. Compliance has been high. Often times, a gentle reminder is all that is needed.

Horseshoe Bend Fence/Big Springs Fence projects... The stain has been purchased and the pickets have been cut. Rich is waiting on the weather. Thank you to Rich for his hard work!

Violations, complaints, concerns...need to be directed to Sentry. Please do not contact individual Board members via email, phone or mail.

Taxes...our 2023 taxes have been completed and our \$10 payment to the State has been made.

Landscaping/Irrigation..._Along with Spring comes irrigation issues as we turn our sprinkler system back on for the season. 5 back flows still need to be replaced/ brought up to standards in the subdivision. We are working with Summer Lawns to develop a plan. There has been a water leak on Lariat that will likely need to be dug up and fixed. In the interim, the water has been turned off. Details are being discussed with Summer Lawns. We had a \$325 water bill for this leak last month.

Virtual/Streamed Meetings...we are looking for ideas to get more of our community involved in the day to day operations of Eagle Springs. Sentry provides Teams, which is an outlet to run our Board meetings online. Our May Board meeting will be our first experience with this service. Look for directions via email 1-2 weeks before the May 16th meeting (note the earlier start time of 6:00 PM).

Activities...our Food Trucks have been a tremendous success! We thank Laurel Marino and Tracy Ayers for arranging those - so much fun! Please see the Food Truck schedule included in this email. Hang it up on your fridge for future reference.

...Pool opening is scheduled for Thursday, May 25th. This coincides with our first Food Truck of the year, KB Burritos, AND the last day of school.



Pool Rules

Only ESHOA MEMBERS, who are in good standing with the

Association and their household, may use these facilities.

Open Daily 8:00 a.m.-10:00 p.m.

Closing day is at 10 PM Sunday of "Labor Day" weekend (may be extended dependent upon weather conditions)

All MEMBERS using these facilities are required to have their identification and pool key card in their possession. NO ONE is allowed entry to the facilities if they do not have their pool key card.

>DO NOT SWIM ALONE!

No lifeguard is on duty ... swim at your own risk ... children must be supervised at all times!

ESHOA and its MEMBERS are not responsible for any injury that might occur through the use of the facilities.

All users of the facilities assume personal responsibility for any injury or accident that may occur.

>Access to the pool and patio area is through the designated gate on the east side of the Clubhouse –assure the gate is locked behind you after entering or exiting the facilities.

AGE & GUEST RULES

≻Children age 12 and under must be supervised by an adult ESHOA resident (age 18 or older).

>ESHOA residents who are 13 years and over may use the pool facilities without adult supervision.

≻Guests are always welcome under the following conditions:

•Guests must be accompanied by an ESHOA resident over the age of 16.

•ESHOA residents ages 16 or 17 years old may have only one (1) guest without an adult MEMBER present.

•ESHOA adult MEMBERS may have up to six (6) guests – with the adult MEMBER always being present.

Hygiene

>Always shower before entering the pool. Wash your hands after using the restroom.

>Persons with open sores, cuts, or any infectious diseases are not permitted in the pool.

>Food and drink are not allowed in the pool. Please clean up spills around the patio area.

>No spitting, spouting water or nose blowing in or around the pool.

>Children not potty trained must wear properly-fitted swim diapers.

Regular diapers are not allowed in the pool.

>No pets are allowed inside the gated pool area.

>No tobacco use of any kind (including E-Cig) is allowed in the facilities.

Safety

>NO DIVING OR FLIPPING INTO POOL!

>No pool furniture allowed in pool water.

>No running, pushing, or rough-housing in the pool or the patio area.

>No glass of any kind is permitted in the pool or around the patio area.

>No skateboards, skates, scooters, bicycles or any other motorized or non- motorized type vehicles or toys (except wagons) are allowed inside the facilities. Please utilize the bike rack located outside of the gate.

>Do not "ride" or climb on or over the gate-Members may be CHARGED FOR DAMAGES.

Small, personal floatation devices are okay to use.

>In consideration of residents living near the facilities, as well as fellow pool users, try to keep the noise levels down at all times. This includes NO yelling or screaming. Headphones must be used when playing any type of audio equipment.

The pool and patio area must be vacated during closing times. Use of the facilities before or after posted hours could result in arrest for trespassing and loss of privileges.
All MEMBERS using these facilities are responsible for assuring that the premises and equipment are left in a clean and undamaged condition. MEMBERS are responsible for any damage to the facilities caused by them, their children, or their guests.
